DISSEMINATION TRAININGS CONTINUE



On March 18th and 25th, we conducted Climate Literacy training with HelpZone participants via online tools. We were happy with the interest of the participants in the program, which was facilitated by Kader Kaya, one of our volunteer trainers, and Banu Binbaşaran, responsible for training programs.

On Saturday, March 26, we held the first face-to-face training of ELN at the Museum Gazhane. We completed our climate literacy training with children and young people aged 13-17 with various games and activities.



After the delays due to snowfall and diseases, our face-to-face programs that we planned for March have been postponed to April. As of April 3, our trainings for 13-17 year olds will continue on a regular basis at the Museum Gazhane in Istanbul. In addition to these, our planning process continues with our volunteer trainers in order to meet the high demands coming from schools. April and May seem to be full. We look forward to your support in the dissemination of trainings.

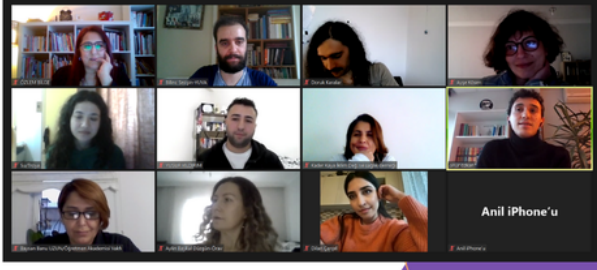

REPORT FOR THE SOLAR POTENTIAL OF THE COAL PLANTS IN TURKEY

In the report, prepared by Solar3GW for Europe Beyond Coal, European Climate Action Network (CAN Europe), Greenpeace Mediterranean, WWF-Turkey (World Wildlife Fund), Climate Change Policy and Research Association, 350.org, Ekosfer and YUVA Association; a preliminary analysis was made on the solar energy installed power and electricity generation potential that can be implemented in open mining coal plants in Turkey.

NEW REPORT FROM KONDA: PERCEPTION OF CLIMATE CHANGE

Konda Research has announced the [Climate Change Perception Report](#), which examines the perception of climate change in Turkey with the sensitivities of different groups:

- 94% of the participants think that the protection of the environment and nature is the responsibility of all segments of society.
- 70% of society says that Turkey's climate goals should be as ambitious as those of the European Union.
- 83% of the participants think that development is possible without harming the environment and nature.
- 3 out of 4 people in the society argue that the environment should not be harmed for the sake of economic development.
- Renewable energy sources are shown as the first choice by far for both economic development and sustaining life.
- Respondents point to extreme heat (76%), forest fires (69%) and floods (62%) as a result of climate change.
- 50% of the participants see the government and ministries, 41% see large companies as the primary responsible ones in the fight against climate change.
- 91% of those who participated in the study stated that they would contribute to the fight against climate change through any one or more actions.
